

HTML (Hypertext Markup Language) Continued

Adding hyperlinks

Hyperlinks are places you can click on to go to other web pages. You can hyperlink words or picture.

Put the `<a href>` tag around just the part you want to click.

The hyperlink will be blue even if you changed the font color to a different color. After you click on the hyperlink it changes to purple.

Try it out with the example below.

```
<html>
<body>
<p>Click to go to <a href="http://www.google.com">Google</a>!/</p>
<p></p>
</body>
</html>
```

This will make the word Google into a hyperlink. Save and try it out.

Now try putting the `<a href>` tag around an image you have on your page.

```
<html>
<body>
<p>Click the picture to go to Google!</p>
<p><a href="http://www.google.com"></a></p>
</body>
</html>
```

Save and refresh this one to see what happens.

Try putting in different websites that you want to link to.

Javascript tricks

There are some fun things you can do with a little scripting.

Add the following to your page, from `<script>` to `</script>`:

```
<html>
<body>
<p><font color="red">This shows the date!</font></p>
<script type="text/javascript">
document.write(Date());
</script>
</body>
</html>
```

Save that, go to the browser, refresh, and see what shows up now.

This next one makes a popup joke:

```
<html>
<body>
<p>Check out this funny joke!</p>
<input type="button" value="Why did the chicken cross the road?"
onclick="alert('What chicken?');" />
</body>
</html>
```

That one is fun! Turn the paper over for another one.

More Javascript tricks

Add some buttons that will change the color of your page!

```
<html>
<body>
<p>Click the button for yellow.</p>
<input type="button" value="Yellow" onClick="document.bgColor='yellow';">
</body>
</html>
```

Now see what happens when you click the button.

Try making more than one button for different colors. Here are the colors you can use:

```
<html>
<body>
<p>Look, two colors!</p>
<input type="button" value="Yellow" onClick="document.bgColor='yellow';">
<input type="button" value="Red" onClick="document.bgColor='red';">
</body>
</html>
```

Wow! Now see what else you can do!

How to embed Youtube videos and other cool stuff

Youtube:

1. Go to Youtube and find an appropriate video you want to show on your web page.
2. Under the video find the "embed" link, click it and copy the contents.
3. Paste it somewhere between the <body> tags of your page. That's all!

Other things you can do:

1. Go to Vocaroo.com, record yourself, click Post on the Internet and copy the HTML code.
2. Add this code to the page to display any other web page inside it:

```
<iframe src="http://somewebpage.com" width="800" height="600"></iframe>
```
